

Advice for Selecting a New House or Apartment

The following list of points was written to a friend of mine. I wrote it in a short, simple and direct manner as she knew nothing of feng shui.



- 1) Look for a house with a solid rectangular footprint (not an L-shaped house, or a T-shaped house...this is very, very important - do you understand what I'm saying here?)
- 2) Do not buy a house at the end of a cul-de-sac or the head of a T-junction of streets
- 3) Do not buy a house across the street or in the direct line of a hospital, church, school or graveyard
- 4) Find out about the history of the previous owners. What you're looking for is someone who did so well in the house that they're moving out to a bigger and better location that more aptly suits their higher lifestyles.
- 5) Add up the numbers of the street address and keep adding until you get a one-digit number. For example, if the address is 64235 then add $6+4+2+3+5 = 20$, so add $2 + 0 = 2$. Two is a good house for a couple, but kids or anyone else will always feel left out. One is a good house to get a divorce in, not good for couples, the energy is one. Three is a house of good communication, everyone feels welcome and free to express themselves. Four is a house of all seasons (to everything there is a season and time to every purpose under heaven). Five is a number for those who want everyone to gravitate to their home, the community gathering place. Six is a female energy, receptive and nurturing. Seven is a spiritual sort of place, like a convent or abbey, where those inside can get in touch with their souls. Eight brings an abundance of all things, but sometimes too much of a good thing. Nine is a male energy house - like the sun, always active and driven to making things happen. If you get an eleven, don't break it down. Eleven houses are mystical and magical. - 6) Don't get a house with a stairway that pours directly out of the front door. Don't get a house that encourages you to look straight out the back of the house as you come in the front door.
- 7) Avoid having a bathroom in your wealth corner or in the romance corner of your bedroom. Wealth corner is farthest back left from the front door, romance corner of bedroom will be furthest back corner to the right.
- 8) Absolutely avoid a house that has a bathroom visible from the front door, directly above the front door, or in the dead center of the house.
- 9) Don't get a house that has a bedroom over the garage unless you're certain you will use that room only for guests or storage.
- 10) Look for a house that has the master bedroom in the Romance corner (furthest back right from the front door) or the Wealth corner (furthest back left from the front door) but not in front of the midline of the house.
